 Gary Thompson moved and the motion was carried unanimously that, "the Board approve the purchase of five, 64 passenger school buses from Western Canada IC Bus Inc. for the total sum of \$429,445 plus applicable taxes on the condition that their tender meets all Wild Rose tender specifications and that administration continue to research the use of alternative fuels for school buses."
