# **Highlights:**

- Parents are 100% satisfied with the access to computers and technology.
- Parents are 94% satisfied with the access to music and physical education.
- 89% of parents are satisfied with the overall quality of education at ÉRE.
- Grade 4 students are 94% satisfied with overall quality of education at ÉRE.
- ÉRE students went on to score very well on the Grade 6 PAT's last June

### Areas to Look into Further:

- Parents would like more student access to drama (66%)
- Parents surveyed indicated a drop in satisfaction with their child receiving help, when needed, with school work (from 80 to 56%) (On the same question, students indicated a rise in satisfaction (From 69 to 75%))
- Parent satisfaction for being involved in school decisions dropped from 80 to 56%
